### INTRODUCTION

The World has been gripped by a pandemic over the first half of 2020. It was identified as a new coronavirus (severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2, or SARS-CoV-2), and later named as Coronavirus Disease-19 or COVID-19 (Qiu et al., 2020). While COVID-19 originated in the city of Wuhan in the Hubei province of China, it has spread rapidly across the world, resulting in a human tragedy and tremendous economic damage. By mid-June, there had been over 8 million cases of COVID-19 globally, with over 436,000 deaths.

Given the rapid spread of COVID-19, countries across the World have adopted several public health measures intended to prevent its spread, including social distancing (Fong et al. (2020)).1 As part of social distancing, businesses, schools, community centres, and nongovernmental organization (NGOs) have been required to close down, mass gatherings have been prohibited, and lockdown measures have been imposed in many countries, allowing travel only for essential needs.2 The goal is that through social distancing, countries will be able to "flatten the curve", i.e., reduce the number of new cases related to COVID-19 from one day to the next in order to halt exponential growth and hence reduce pressure on medical services (John Hopkins University, 2020a).

The spread of COVID-19 is expected to result in a considerable slowdown of economic activities. According to an early forecast of the International Monetary Fund (2020a), the global economy would contract by about 3 percent in 2020. The contraction is expected to be of far greater magnitude than that of the 2008-2009 Global Financial Crisis. However, in its latest update (June 2020), the International Monetary Fund (2020b) revised the forecast to 4.9 percent contraction in 2020. The report cites the following reasons for the updated forecast: i) greater persistence in social distancing activities; ii) lower activity during lockdowns; iii) steeper decline in productivity amongst firms which have opened up for business; and iv) greater uncertainty.3 The economic implications will be wide-ranging and uncertain, with different effects on the labor markets, production supply chains, financial markets, and the World economy. The negative economic effects may vary by the stringency of the social distancing measures (e.g., lockdowns and related policies), its length of implementation, and the degree of compliance. In addition, the pandemic and the government intervention may lead to mental health distress, increased economic inequality, and affect some socio-demographic groups particularly adversely.

The goal of this piece is to survey the emerging literature on the economic consequences of COVID-19 and government response, and to synthesize the insights emerging from a growing number of studies.4 By the end of May, there had been 106 papers related to COVID-19. Similarly, over 60 discussion papers on the pandemic were released by the IZA Institute of Labour Economics5 during March-May 2020.

In order to prevent the human to human transmission of the novel coronavirus, the government has imposed a nationwide lockdown leading to the shutdown of industries and public transports. Due to the shutdown of factories and workplaces, local labourers, and migrant workers had to deal with the loss of income, food shortages, and uncertainty about their future. Thousands of migrant daily workers began walking back to their native places, with no means of transport due to the lockdown. In response to this, the Central and State Governments took various measures to help them and also arranged transport facilities for the workers .

There are about 139 million daily labourers in the country approximately, according to the World Economic Forum. The International Labour Organization has said that due to the pandemic and the lockdown, about 400 million workers have been poverty-stricken. Daily labourers in the country are mostly seen in Uttar Pradesh and Bihar, followed by Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, and Tamil Nadu. The cities of Mumbai and Delhi have recorded the highest number of migrant daily workers. Migrant workers mainly comprise daily-wage labourers working in the manufacturing industries and constructions. Daily-wage labourers are often denied adequate healthcare, nutrition, housing, and sanitation, as many of them work in the informal sector. Daily-wage labourers are mostly from rural areas but are found in cities for work. Many workers have no savings and live in factory dormitories, which were shut down due to the lockdown.

Corona virus is a pandemic disease which has affected throughout the world without reason and seeing Colour, Religion, Cast, Language, Literate, Illiterate, Business Men, Daily Wage Worker (Kooli), Rich, Poor and Middle Class, etc. This virus might have affected nearly 40,00,000 people around the world and may cross 3,00,000 death rate globally by the time of this Research Article is published. Everyone knows that this virus was detected first in the City of Wuhan in Hubei Province, China and named a person as Covid-19 patient on 17/11/2019. Then slowly it started affecting the world countries without boundaries. In this order, when India was about to get affected by COVID-19 virus, the government of India decided to implement Lock Down / Shutdown from 25/03/2020 to 14/04/2020 for the first time and extended again from 15/04/2020 to 03/04/2020 for the second time and then now it is for the third time again extended from 04/05/2020 to 17/05/2020. This Lock Down system is to secure the people's life by preventing them from Corona Virus. So it is a very good system and also helps the people to prevent from corona by isolating and staying at home. In the beginning of the lockdown period, people were able to manage from their own financial sources what they had as savings. Later, when their financial position was zero, they started crying for food and money to look after their children and aged people at home. This is the time that the government, local authorities and volunteer organization may plan and support the people to compensate their basic needs.

The Lock Down / Shutdown days affected the total Indian economy. All type of Industries like Hotels, Transports (Roadways, Airways and Seaways), Automobile sectors, Electronic sectors, Chemical sectors, IT sectors, Tourism, Textiles, Film Industries and even the Agriculture based Industries have been affected because of unusual condition. There is no doubt that all those sectors are the back born of the Indian Economy and can be raised back with concrete plan. But very harm and sad is that these Lock Down / Shutdown days entirely changed the life standard of the people who belong to the daily wage worker (Cooli) society up to the boundary of expecting even a cup of food for minimum of one time per day. This research article is the result of having studied the life standard of that particular group of people (Daily Wage Workers). The Building Construction, House Keeping, Dry Cleaning, Rag Picking, Traditional Instrument Playing, Cooking, Hair Dressing (Barbers), Vessels Cleaning in Tea Stalls & Mini Tiffin Centers, Scavenging, Street Selling, Mechanic Shops, Super Market, Retail Shop, Weight Lifting in Market are giving the job opportunities to the daily wage workers. But the lockdown periods stopped the functions of all those places and so they totally locked the life of the daily wage workers without food, money, routine medicines and satisfy the needs of the children.

#### IMPORTANCE OF STUDY

The fact that labour in India, in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic, has been trapped in an unprecedented crisis, in living memory, is widely acknowledged. The employment and livelihoods of the overwhelming majority of workers have taken huge hits, and a massive uncertainly continues to loom over their immediate foreseeable future. This project focuses on how the Daily Wagers in India has been impacted by the pandemic, and it seeks to investigate the ongoing challenges. Corona virus is a pandemic disease which has affected throughout the world without reason. The lock down days affected the total Indian economy. All types of industries like hotel, transport, film industries, electricity. But very harm and sad is that these lock down days entirely changed the life standard of the people who belong to the days wage worker (cooli) society up to the boundary of expecting even a cup of food for one time per a day.

The term daily wage workers means any person who are working in the premises of the employer and who is employed directly or indirectly or through an agencies including a contract for wage in any kind of work and who gets their wage directly for indirectly from the employer.

In the begging of the lockdown periods people were able to manage from their own financial sources what they had or savings .Later when financial position was zero ,they standardized crying for food and money to lookafter their children and trying to borrow money from the moneylenders with high rate of interest rate. The sudden implementation of lockdown meant that workers found them self without jobs and earnings for an unknown periods ,as factories and construction sites were closed. This project focuses on how daily wage workers in Wayanad have been impacted by the pandemic and it investigate the ongoing challenge.

#### STATEMENT OF THE STUDY

Daily wage workers are the most effected section in the Indian economy due to the shutdown during

covid-19. The lockdown system is to secure the people's life by preventing them from corona virus. The outbreak of corona virus is having a severe impact on the living condition of the people who belong to daily wage society. 

#### **REVIEW OF LITERATURE**

**Aron O Neill (March 17 2000)** Increase in the hourly wages in the US during the Spanish flue pandemic 1900\_ 1948\_Wages across the industries had increased gradually and steadly in line with inflation with the hourly wage in manufacturing increasing from roughly 15 units to 21 units per hour in the period.

Labour of Industrial Law (Misra 2009). Misra presented the twenty one labour laws containing labour related issues like wages, their relations with social security legislation etc. He stressed of the out applicability and wage structure with the help of various case law. The component of minimum wage, rice wage and living wages, modes of fixing. The legal provisions and penalties for its contraventions for not providing minimum wages to the labour was stressed in his study.

Socio-economic status of the Workers of Building Construction(Guddi Tiwary,2012) The researchers diffused on the socio-economic conditions of the construction workers using cross sectional perspective method of study. He conducted his study using stratified sampling methods taking 150 of construction workers as samples from an unorganised sector. He termed construction workers as 'Daily Wage Earners' and mentioned that they maintained their families with low income.

'The future of work - trends and challenges of low wage workers'.(Thesis 2012) The repeat by thesis focused on who are low wage workers and what their future challenges. The repeated found that female young and Minority workers are usually over presented when low wage workers study is taken.

Challenges and problems faced by women worker the India (Azadeh Barati 2015) Faced on challenges and problems faced by the women workers. It was faced that women has to manage their walk all workplace along with their household works and again there is a difference in the payment of wages in space of having equal working.

**Santha Saraswathi( February 2017 )**: According to the author Kerala is witnessing large flow of labour from different part of country. Higher wages for unskilled labour's in the state shortage of lacal higher unemployment rate in Kerala led to massive inflow of migrant labours to the state.

#### NDTV special piogutes december 2018.

He found that the low pay and wage inequalities in India dispute 7% annual average GDP growth over the past two decades. The labour market in India are characterised by disputes. According to this report said, while women daily wages may have increase more rapidly.

"Daily wage labour market worker: cause and consequence" Ahashad and Nazim Ali(March 2018)- In their study they found that about two-third population of daily wage labourers market workers was the outcome of few causes, family poverty, unemployment, low income and absence of regular work. In addition to this maximum share of unemployment and low wages are the main consequences of daily labour market worker in the city.

India today report on 26/03/2020-corona virus in India: Daily wage workers led by lockdown. As the country grapples with the rise in covid 19 cases, people have been forced to remain indoor during the pandemic but the worst affected are daily wages and other labourers. The covid curfew has robbed daily wages of their daily income. They said they have no food to feed them and their families. Many workers also wish to leave city but are left stranded as the railway and bus services have been suspended in light of pandemic.

The Times on India report on 13/04/2020. Workers go hungry as Tamilnadu Government's wage order remains dead letter. The lock down might be a measure to prevent and control covid-19. But in this process the people dependent on daily weekly wages have hot only lost their livelihood but we also struggling to make end meet- while. The government announced a date of 1000 and a hamper of 15kg of rise, 1kg dal and 1kg oil the ground reality is grim.

**Swathi Hajri Najkawada (may 2020).** They focused the minimum wage cut in 1948 and the authors stressed on salient features of the act Maharashtra minimum wage cut rates i963. He stressed that the object of the act is not only to provide minimum wage to workers but to give other facilities like medical ,education and others . The absence of such facilities affect the working efficiency of the workers.

**Titus lalith ,jyothi Priya & brundha m p ( September 24 2020)**. The aim of the study to get knowledge about the crisis and to create awareness of the problem forced by daily wage workers during lockdown .In this study 8.4% of participants thinks that covid-19 lockdown led to loss of the only source of income of the daily labour's 61.2% of participants thinks that daily labour's don't have enough of the daily wages to survive lockdown.


**Arpita Raj (12may 2020)** According to her urban India appealed with 8 in 10 workers in urban areas (80%)and almost 6 in 10 workers inrural areas( 57%) reporting loss in source of income. Half (49%) of households reported that they did not have enough money to buy.

**Dr.Arjun De Haam 19 October 2020 labour migrants during the pandemic-**Labours migrants manifested itself in extreme way on India ,when government announced a lockdown ,labour migrant found themselves in the void of having lost their jobs,sometimes their housing and in large number of case having lost their income and there for with No after native for return to other village.

**Zothan Mawill (June 2020)**\_ covid 19 & an ensuring lockdown had a devastating impact on informal workers and workers from economically weaker sections of society. The lockdown was poorly planned and lift workers found it's very difficult to love without earning.

**India Today Report on 19/04/2020** covid -19lock down :Daily wage workers struggle to make ends meet\_Amid nation wide lockdown to crub the spread of novel corona virus ,many have been forced to remain indoor with daily wage workers being worst affected. It has robbed the daily wage workers of their daily income. They struggle to buy food with no money.

India Today Report 2/04/2020-'corona virus lockdown '-Daily wage workers are surviving on donated food .one 60 years old widow Bala says that 'no money means no ration'.food packages are not enough to feed my family .sometimes we are not got just one packet and we all eat from it Don't know what government is planning to doubt at least food ore rations should be provided by government on a regular basis ,at least basics like flour ,rice or sugar.

#### INTRODUCTION


Wayanad is an Indian district in the north\_east of kerala state with administrative headquarters at the municipality of kalpetta. It is set high on the western ghats with altitudes ranging from 700 to 2100meters. The district was formed on 1 november 1980as the 12th district in kerala by carving out areas from Kozhikode and kannur districts. About 885.95sq. Km of area of the district is under forest. Wayanad has three municipal townes\_kalpetta, Mananthavady and sulthan Bathery. Wayanad district is bordered by Karnataka to north and north\_east, Tamil Nadu to the south\_West and Kannur to the north \_west. pulpally in Wayanad boasts of the only Lavakusha tample in kerala and Vythiri has the only mirror tample in kerala which is a jain temple. Varambetta mosque is the oldest Muslim mosque of wayanad. People of wayanad live in absolute harmony with each other. The edicts and caves of Ambukuthi Mala and another evidence state that the place is as old as the beginning of the New Age Civilisation.

#### **HISTORY**

In the ancient times this land was ruled by the Rajas of the Veda tribe. In later times, Wayanad came under the rule of Pazhassi Rajas of Kottayam royal dynasty. When Hyder Ali became the ruler of Mysore, he invaded Wayanad and brought it under his way. In the days of Tipu, Wayanad was restored to the Kottayam royal dynasty.

The Britishers opened up the Plateau for cultivation of tea and other cash crops. Roads were laid across the dangerous slopes of Wayanad from Calicut and Telicherry.

When the state of Kerala was formed in 1956, Wayanad was part of Kannur district. Later South Wayanad was added to Kozhikode district and then on November 1, 1980 North and South Wayanad joined together to form the present Wayanad district.

#### **IMPACTS OF COVID-19**

The impact of the lockdown was most severe in the case of self-employed and casual workers in all sectors of the economy. Due to a curfew like situation there was a total stop of almost all activities of in the informal sector except the trade of essential goods and agricultural operations. A good portion of the workers engaged in some type of regular employment in private sector also lost their jobs. The only category of workers who were not affected are those workers in public sector viz. state and central governments, public sector undertakings, autonomous institutions, universities and semi government institutions. Based on the loss of GSDP for the various sectors and considering the distribution of workers to various sectors, we feel that the 69 days lockdown has pushed more than two third of self-employed and casual workers to acute unemployment, financial crisis, indebtedness and economic distress.

A characteristic feature of employment is the dominance of the informal sector consisting of self-employed, casual labour and a part of the regular employed which have the features of casual employment. The entire self-employed, casual labour and a major share of regular wage/salary employment come under informal sector (nearly 84%). According to National Statistical Office (NSO) survey, of the total employment 32.9 percent is regular wage/salary employment consists of jobs in public and private sectors and earn to get a wage on a regular basis – monthly wage or a daily wage or piece wage rate (Table 9). The share of self-employed is 37.8 percent and casual labour 29.3 percent. A rural urban breakup of the employment shows that the share of self-employed and casual labour is much higher in rural .

The lockdown implemented in the state has resulted in an unprecedented loss of employment in all sectors of the economy. Due to the prolonged lockdown, Quarantine, physical distancing and other isolation measures to suppress transmission of the COVID-19, the state's economy is heading towards a recession. Non-essential services and production were directly affected by the lockdowns, which led, among other things, to a reduction in the number of hours worked and the job losses. The State with greater dependence on the service sector, higher levels of informality and weak safeguards against the termination of employment has been facing higher initial job losses. The lockdown has resulted in huge loss of employment of all categories- self-employed, regular and casual labours. According to our estimate total loss of employment in manufacturing and construction was more than 50%. In territory sector, the sub sectors which registered more than 50% loss of employment were trade; repair of motor vehicles; transportation and storage; accommodation.


The origin of the outbreak has been traced to seven members belonging to two families, related to each other. All had tested positive after attending a funeral of a relative who died of COVID-19 recently.

A major coronavirous hotspot has emerged in a remote Village in this district with a total of 199 people testing positive so far after eight members of two families contracted it first. As many as 169 people tested positive in valad ward of Thavinhal panchayath till Thursday and 30more on Friday, taking the infection count to 199 as authorities undertook extensive screening of primary and secondary contacts since early this Week, officials said.

"The panchayath has been made a containment zone since Monday and We are hopeful of containing further spread of the virus". Health department sources said. The hilly Wayanad district has a total of 310 positive cases so far and 2753 people are under observation. It all began with seven members belonging to two families, related to each other, turned positive for the deadly virus last week after attending a funeral of a relative who died of COVID-19 at the Kozhikode Medical college Hospital recently.

According to health department sources, the estimated primary contacts in this area could be over 500 and the secondary contacts between 1500to2000. Medical terms are working overtime to collect more secondary contacts of the infected persons, they added.

Three entry points to the panchayath through the periya Churam, palchuram and pakramthalam churam roads had been closed by the district administration with only trucks goods and essentials permitted. On Saturday, wayanad accounted for 124 cases out of the 1310 fresh infections in the states, which took its tally past the 23,000 mark.





































#### FINDINGS OF THE STUDY

- -Based on the data analysis and interpretation of the study the following are the major findings of the study.
- -The days of freezing/closing affected the entire economy. All types of industries such as Hotels, Transportation, Automatic sectors, Chemical sectors, and even agricultural industries have been affected due to the unusual conditions.
- -55% respondents collectively fece financial and food problems as they are basic necessities for living. At the same time some of the respondents face problems of social, psychological and emotional trauma.
- -The surprising death of new lives and the pandemic death of Covid-19 has completely closed the lives of people without work, without food, without income, without security and has generated a problem of social, psychological and emotional trauma.
- -Majority of respondents are disagreed when asked if their income was enough to meet their daily needs.
- -78% of people have seek the help of the government. Therefore the government, Local authorities, volunteer teams and Non-governmental organizations came forward and took immediate action to save people from starvation first and then save them from the Covid-19 virus.

#### **SUGGESTIONS**

- \*Suggesting new policies and programmes for the upliftment of daily wage workers from the government.
- \* Introduction of new fixed wage system for daily labour's.
- \*Proper intervention and stregthening of daily wage labour union.
- \*Government should ensure that the finance company or banks does not force the daily wage peoples to repay the loans on covid pandamic.
- \*Government must provide financial assistant to improve the standard of living of the people.
- \*Lockdown relaxation may be given to those daily wage workers to do their work through which they may stand on their own legs and not looking at other hand.
- \* People are to be guided to overcome various social, psychological and emotional traumas that they face during lock down.
- \*Proper medical facilities ,clean drinking water facilities and sanitary facilities are to be ensured at minimum cost at least.
- \*Food, grocery packets and necessary medicines are to be provided at free price.

#### CONCLUSION

The Covid-19 outbreak was declared a global health emergency. Our country is a labour oriented and labour intensive society. It is prime duty of the government to protect the living conditions and economy of the basic labourers. The daily wage workers usually face many problems like irregularity and imbalanced payment structure. Under all those unavoidable critical conditions, the daily wage workers are swimming upstreame and living their life. Unexpectedly the stunning new life killing and pandemic decease Covid-19 fully locked the entire life of the people with no job, no food, no income and generated social, psychological and emotional traumas problem. The security and well-being of labourers is of utmost importance in the growth of our economy. The present study confirms that the public is aware of the economic and food crisis faced by daily labourers during lockdown. The government should also implement a scheme so as to provide daily needs to labourers. So the government, local authorities and non government organisations should come forward and do immediate measure to save people.



#### **INTRODUCTION**

The world has been gripped by a pandemic over the first half of 2020. It was identified as a new corona virus (severe acute respiratory corona virus 2, or SARS-COV-2), and later named as corona virus Diseases-19. While COVID-19 originated in the city of Wuhan in the Hubei province of china, it has spread rapidly across the world, resulting in a human tragedy and tremendous economic damage. By mid-June, there had been over 8 million cases of COVID-19 globally, with over 436,000 deaths.

Given the rapid spread of COVID-19, countries across the world have adopted several public health measures intended to prevent its spread, including social distancing. As part of social distancing, business, schools, Community Centre's , and non-governmental organization (NGOs) have been required to close down, mass gatherings have been prohibited, and non-governmental organization (NGOs) have been required to close down measures been imposed in many countries , allowing travel only for essential needs. The goal is that through social distancing, countries will be able to "flatten the curve". Reducing the number of new cases related to COVID-19 from one day to the next in order to halt exponential growth and hence reduce pressure on medical services (John Hopkins University, 2020).

India reported the first confirmed case of the corona virus infection on January 30, 2020 in the state of Kerala. The affected person had a travel history from Wuhan, china to Thrissur district. The total COVID-19 patients in India increased from February 2, 2020 to 37.66 lakh in September 1, 2020. The number of COVID-19 patients more than doubled during the month of August. The number of death increased to 66,460. The disturbing issue with regard to the spread of COVID-19 in the states is the low rate of testes conducted to detect COVID-19 cases in the first phase. Also the reporting system in the country is far from reliable and in a situation such as COVID-19, there could be a high propensity for under reporting at all levels. There for the actual number of COVID-19 cases in India could be slightly higher, if not many times more.

In India 68 days national lockdown has inflicted severe damage on all sectors of national and states economy, and pushed the economy to an unprecedented recession. The IMF forecasts that Indian GDP will register a negative growth of (-) 4.5 in the fiscal year 2020-21. The Asian development bank projects a negative growth of (-) 9of GDP. Domestic economic activity has been impacted severely by the two-month lockdown and subsequent restriction. The top six industrialized states that account for 60% of India's industrial output are largely in red and orange zones. The biggest blow is to private consumption that accounts for 60% of domestic demand. The centre for monitoring Indian economy (CMIE) estimated that India's unemployment rate increased to 24% for the week ended May 17, 2020. The rural unemployment was 23% and the urban unemployment rate was 27%. The available evidence suggests that the spread of COVID-19 has been pushing the economy to recession.

COVID-19 had affected economy in several ways; one of the most affected areas is public transport. According to **Prof. Geelam Tiwari** (professor for transport planning, IIT Delhi) "Public transport is an essential service, should not be treated as a business." Transportation sector become one of the primary victims of COVID-19. **Arun Bothra**, (Indian express) **28 July 2020**, the COVID crisis has crippled all sectors of the economy, not only in India but across the world. Public transport is one of the worst affected sectors, as it will face long term effects due to COVID-19. From rickshaw pullers to airlines, all have been affected economically by the pandemic. **Mr. Aravind Harikumar** on **8 April 2020** (Terrin.org), Transportation sector has been one of the primary victims of COVID-19. From rickshaw pullers to airlines, all have been affected by the pandemic.

The intermediate mode of transportation such as auto-rickshaws (auto taxi) and car taxi being a critical player in the urban transportation system, also have a noticeable impact on the lively hood of the people working in the sector. These include operator, mechanics, drivers, and manufacturers, among others- a lot of them living as migrants away from home. Not only their livelihood in terms of daily earnings disappeared, but they also could service the bank loan or any other form of private loans leading to financial distress. Even after the phase-vise lifting of lockdown, the regular users do not feel comfortable to return to usual travel an account of keeping a safe distance from the driver. Sharing rides with other passengers is a think of the past now. According to Jullia bird, Sebastia Kristicos( economist), Public transport has been it by COVID-19 with ridership significantly down, operates in developing cities will have to face difficult question for these future viability. The appropriate response must plan for contingencies, but never forget the value of shared transit in the process of economic development.

During the initial phase of lockdown and after while ride-hailing services like urban and ola were deployed for emergency services for health care workers, the use of auto rickshaws was limited for informal transport of goods like fruits, vegetables, and groceries. In some cases, the BPL ration card holders among the auto-rickshaw and car taxi community could support their families to get adequate food but non-BPL cardholders could not even get minimal support. Several auto-rickshaw owners even paid rent, for parking their vehicles during the lockdown. Most of them are facing issues in repaying their loans and cooperative loans. Although a moratorium of two months for loan repayments was declared in March 2020, many had to resort to taking private loans.

Relaxations and un-lockdown has been resumed in many cities with certain restrictions. These vehicles were sanitized making them safe for travel with 1+1 seating, wearing masks, maintaining social distance etc. as prescribes by regulatory authorities. During the lockdown, the earning of drivers were adversely affected as they could earn only a fourth to half of their income before lockdown the traffic enforcement and travel restrictions along with low demand resulted in shorter trips. So the auto-taxi drivers could cover only approximately around 30-40 km per day against 90-120 km per day pre lockdown. In many cases, the auto-rickshaw pullers have to travel without passengers which accumulates dead km without any earning. In the current crisis, some of the drivers even increased the prices to almost three times to improve their earnings causing hardships to

the public. Many auto drivers also switched to other sources of livelihoods such as delivering grocery, medicine, and other essential goods or other businesses like selling fruits and vegetables or relocated to their native villages.

Even though the ministry of road transports and highways extended the validity of fitness, permit (all types) driving license, registration or any other concerned documents whose extension of validity could or not likely be processed due to lockdown and which have expired since February 1, till June 30,2020. State government decided to support autorickshaw and taxi drivers by providing one-time compensation to each of them who is an auto –rickshaw license holder ranging from Rs 5000 to Rs 10000. The RBI has granted a moratorium of two months for loan repayment March 2020.

However, this ensuring survey and interpretations will focus on the effects of shut down during pandemic which might have added to the turmoil faced by the auto rickshaw drivers. The primary public transport in India is auto-rickshaw. However, the auto drivers earn only INR 700 to INR 1000 a day, which turns out to be quite less for proper survival. Perhaps, savings must have been quite difficult or next to impossible with such low wages. On the contrary, extra responsibilities such as loans and children's education are many a times bottle necks for most of the drivers. This adverse condition was added up due to the sudden epidemic of COVID-19, which deteriorated the financial state. Hence, this study underlines the challenges suffered by auto-taxi drivers and touching their lives to acquaint readers about their existence.

The paper also throws some light on their mental state and takes over it. The required motivation for the questionnaire was provided while distributing ration to the auto-taxi drivers. The interpretations are solely based on the answers provided by the 50 drivers through the questionnaire.

#### **SCOPE OF THE STUDY**

The epidemic of COVID-19 disrupted the life style of every ordinary person. Among a group of ordinary people who work and live only a daily basis, it has created obstacles in their smooth running of work. This created a huge challenge in their daily lives. Auto taxi drivers and car taxi drivers determine their daily fare based on public travel. However, COVID-19 remains a threat to the lives of every worker. Fearing the plague of COVID-19, all the people want to stay indoors and go out only when necessary. This has a profound effect on the lives of auto taxi and car taxi drivers who earn a living from their daily work. They make a living by serving the public. However, COVID-19 caused major rifts in their daily lives. As passengers did not leave, they preferred to travel in their own vehicles, cultivating the idea that public transportation did not provide protection, all of which greatly reduced the daily income of ordinary auto and car taxi drivers. This made their family life difficult. However, they were ready to fight the COVID-19 epidemic. Auto and car taxi drivers were extremely careful. The mask was mandatorily worn by each individual, social distance was maintained and sanitizers were mandatory in vehicle. The cooperation of the passengers helped to improve the status of each auto and car taxi driver. Public transportation is essential to meet the needs without having your own vehicle. The public plays a huge role in the lives of auto and car taxi drivers. Staying at home instead of on public roads can lead to starvation in the lives of auto and car taxi drivers. To eliminate it, every standard driver must comply with the COVID-19 protocol. It was the resistance to the COVID-19 that kept the lives of auto and car taxi drivers out of poverty. For that, they ensure advance protection. Let's see what they are:

- 1) The mask must be worn on the face. This reduces the spread of the disease by blocking hearing from one person to another.
- 2) Disinfect hand frequently with sanitizer and soap. This prevents the disease through personal contact.
- 3) The auto taxi driver accurately sets the social distance for each passenger. Decreasing the number of passengers reduces contact.
- 4) Realizing that there is no daily income, auto and car taxi charges are increased in a way that is not inconvenient for the public.

#### METHODOLOGY OF THE STUDY

Methodology is the systematic and theoretical analysis of the method applied to field of study. It comprises the theoretical analysis of the body of method and principles associated with a branch of knowledge. Methodology explains the techniques or method of data sources tools. The present study is based on the primary and secondary data. Typically, it encompasses concept such as paradigm, theoretical model, Phases and quantitative or qualitative techniques.

According to **Clifford woody** (Kothari 1988) research comprises "defining and redefining problem. Formulating hypothesis or suggested solutions: collecting organising and evaluating data: making deductions and reaching conclusion: and finally carefully testing the conclusions.

The present study is an attempt to examine the impact of COVID 19 on taxi sector especially in auto and car taxi with reference to Wayanad district. The study aims to analyse the problems and challenges faced by the taxi drivers and to understand the safety measures taken by the taxi sector as precaution against Corona.

#### **LOCALE OF THE STUDY**

The present study was carried out in Wayanad district in Kerala state. For the present district consist of 4 blocks and 23 punchayats with a population of 8,46,637. Manathavady, Sulthan Bathery and Kalpetta are the three municipality in Wayanad district. According to data collected from the drivers 25 samples were taken from each car taxi and auto-taxi drivers of these 3 municipalities.

#### **SOURCES OF DATA**

The present study is based on primary data as well as secondary data. The present study is analytical and descriptive in nature. The method of sampling used for the present study was random sampling. Random sampling method gives equal chance to each and every one. The sample unit for the study is collected 50 samples from auto and car taxi drivers.

#### PRIMARY DATA

The primary data was collected using a questionnaire based survey method, created on Google forms. This analysis used an online questionnaire, which took 10-15 minutes per person to answer. The questionnaire was sent to the selected 50 drivers of car and auto taxi through e-mail and WhatsApp. The responses of the drivers were collected and complied and quantitative or qualitative approach was used for the study by performing a comparative analysis of the responses. A copy of questionnaire has been given in the appendix.

The third chapter contains the profile of the study. It includes the details of study area.


Fourth chapter of the project is the main effort of the research is the data analysis and interpretation of the figures and tables which has been frame from questionnaires.

#### **LIMITATION OF THE STUDY**

- > The sample size is limited to 50 respondents only.



#### **REVIEW OF LITERATURE**

Review of literature is important in any research work. The purpose of the study is to give an overview of in some of earlier studies on transportation in India. It also includes the studies on the effect of COVID-19 on public transportation. A review of literature is nothing but a review of theoretical, empirical and methodological issue on the subject. This help in providing a meaning full direction and thought for appropriate research questions and policy making.

The study of **Mahesh Chand** (February 1979) aimed at studying the characteristics of auto rickshaw transport system and to suggest methods to improve in the service the study did not attempt to study the socio-economic problems and issues of auto drivers but the study suggested improving the auto rickshaw at Bangalore.

**Rajesh Ranjan**, has conducted a research on the title "common work life balance of auto rickshaw drivers in Mumbai." He has found that the quality of life is highest for those who are more engaged or more satisfied in family than work and is lowest for those who are engaged or more satisfied in work than family.

**Walker** (1981) conducted a social economic study of Rick rickshaw pullers in the city of Nagpur. Nagpur has the highest number of registered cycle rickshaw pullers in the country it is interesting even in the present age of modernization match against Bangalore with the commuter do not believe one man pulling the other man then the number of cycle rickshaw pullers are increasing.

**Anvita Anand and Rajendra Ravi** (2002) have studied in the studied at the batch training program conducted for auto rickshaw drivers in Delhi has been a step towards hosting socially responsible behaviour on the part of the drivers the study also revealed the government effort and 2 and to discuss the improvement need in public transport system.

Ashwani luthra (2006) has carried out the study of Para-transit system of transportation in medium sized cities are problem or panacea; she had also find some major problems regarding the Para-transit system .for her study she had selected Amritsar, Punjab as a case study. Her study was based on various research findings regarding traffic characteristics and role of PTS (Para-transit system) in medium sized cities. Role of PTS was empirically tested and was based on analysis of primary data collected for traffic volume, speed and parking characteristics during peak hours. Wherever required comparisons were done with norms and standards evolved by the Indian Road Congress to identify the problem areas in operations of the PTS. According to her study that 60 percent of the PTS drivers are illiterate. Only 20 percent drivers have attained education up to tenth standard. Thus low level of literacy and easy employment in PTM operations tempt the drivers to adopt this profession. On average an auto rickshaw driver earns Rs.200 per day, whereas a cycle rickshaw driver earns about Rs.100 per day. The PTS poses some serious problems and issues that alarm the city authorities to take corrective actions to improve its performance which are absence of planning for the PTS (para-transit system), Imbalanced Land Use

Pattern, Encroachments, No Parking Facilities, Increased Heterogeneity of Traffic, Illiteracy and No Administrative Control, Planning for Routes and Operation, Controlled Land Use. After the study she had suggested some suggestions that Proper provisions should be made to provide required infrastructure for different PTMs. Proper parking lots, with provisions of shelter to counter the adverse weather, should be planned at appropriate locations. While designing the parking lots near intersections care should be taken to locate them at an appropriate distance from the junction. Generally, 100 meter clear space is recommended at the junctions. Efforts should be made to remove encroachments, if any, on/ along the PTM parking lots so that they can be optimally utilized.

"Akshay mani and Pallavi pant" (October 2012) EMBARQ India has compiled a study presenting a review of available literature in the urban auto rickshaw sector in India. The object of this study is to understand the current state of the sector, summarize the key issue and highlight the gaps in current literature.

M. Ali Ahmed& Wickham Victory (2012) have carried out the study on para-transit mode of transportation in the medium size city Imphal, the main objective of the study was to find the role of para-transit mode in the small and medium size cities in India. Major four types of para-transit modes are playing in the study area - cycle rickshaw, auto rickshaw, Tata magic, maruti vans in the city to provide the needs of transportation services to the urbanites. Among these, auto rickshaw has the highest percentage share of occupants with respect to all the modes. Three types of survey they have carried out which are modal split survey, vehicular occupancy survey, operator survey.to know the numbers of modes available they have carried out modal split survey. To find out the average number of passengers they have carried out vehicle occupancy survey. They have selected the specific places like market area, local roads, major roads, minor roads, important public places to know the usage of paratransit modes and its variations. From the analyzed data the paratransit auto-rickshaw has the maximum percentage share of 69%, Tata magic 16%, van 10% and cycle-rickshaw of 5%. Also they have analyzed that the 30 % of the auto drivers were between 20-30 age group. It is observed that para-transit modes are creating congestion in the urban street because of its slow speed, overcrowding of passengers, unsystematic parking policy, etc. Predefined stoppages to pick up and alight passengers. The maximum number of passengers carried should be less than or equal to the capacity of the vehicle. Auto-rickshaw may not be permitted further to reduce the noise pollution. Counter for collecting tickets for reserved taxies to be used by the passengers should be made. Separate lanes may be provided for the slow moving para-transit like Cycle rickshaw as it causes more traffic jams. The old auto-rickshaw may be removed from the city for pollution control.

M.Yesurajan and D.T. Indira in their research work, titled, "common work related health problems of auto rickshaw drivers in India-causes and strategies" has revealed that the auto drivers are exposed to a number of health problems as a direct result of the posture adopted in driving. They also found that the auto drivers are not properly concern their health due to busy schedule on their work. The driving posture causes problems for the digestive system and the incidence of smoking and drinking also affects the health of the auto rickshaw drivers.

"Madhav pai, Akshay mani and Rishi Aggarwal" (February 2012) report addresses how the auto rickshaw sector can play a key role in improving sustainability for urban transport and addresses negative perception of rickshaws. They also introduce new adopted for a more efficient and safer system and enable the rickshaws to have an optional role in transport mix.

case study of auto rickshaw industry in Mumbai India by **Masha last Akshay money** (January 1st 2014) this paper is to conduct an in-depth assessment of Mumbai auto rickshaw factor to gain insights into its role in the cities transport system and the challenges that effective face is to present recommendations for reforms that would benefit auto rickshaws as a part of sustainable urban transport system for the city.

Laxman Singh Bisht & Mokaddes Ali Ahmed (2015) have carried out the study on socioeconomic characteristics of auto rickshaw operators in Silchar city, during Their study main objective was to find out the socio economic characteristics of the auto rickshaw drivers. The basic socio economic status indicators on which they have studied were literacy rate, average household size, housing status (kutcha, semi-pucca, and pucca), and household type. they have carried out a three types of surveys they have carried out Traffic Volume Survey, Auto rickshaw Operators Questionnaire Survey, Vehicular Occupancy Survey Based on the survey many important facts were revealed. Most of the operators are from Silchar itself or nearby villages of the Silchar city. Most of the operators are from the age group of 21 to 30.Most of the operators are under matric as educational qualification .many operators have taken loan for vehicle purchase from private banks or under government schemes. This study has established the role of auto rickshaw in urban passenger movement in Silchar city. Most of the auto rickshaw operators belong to low income group. They belong to the economically weaker section of society. Their main source of income is auto rickshaw operation only. Maximum operators are sole income earner in his family. In addition to basic problems of livelihood of auto rickshaw operators have other problems like non-availability of parking space at desired locations. All auto operators learned driving by themselves. Maximum auto rickshaws are not in good condition and polluting the city air.

"Hall Jonathan and Kruger Alan (2015), research was the first comprehensive analysis of uber's driver-partners, based on both survey data and administrative data. A large driver population chose uber over traditional taxi service because of the flexibility in timing .The drivers joining Uber did not decline even after the economy had strengthen and employment increased. This proves that drivers were attracted towards the flexible work hours and the incentives provided by Uber. The presence of sophisticated Uber application and lower prices attracted consumers and Uber taxi service was opted over traditional taxi service

"kholid Farah ,Abdullah syazwani ,kamly khairunnisa and Abdul Syed, Jamal (2015),studied that with regard to the level of the taxi drivers "attitudes the dimensions which are mostly neglected by them are safety, empathy hygiene and courtesy .The other major factors that lead towards drivers poor attitude include financial problems, family commitment and low education level. In this research strategies have been outlined to improve the situation of taxi industry.

Anindita Ghosh and Kanika Kalra (2016) have carried out a study on Intermediate Public Transport (IPT) like 3wheelers auto rickshaws, tempos and Tata Magic. For their study they have visited 19 Indian cities across the country. They have categories the 19 cities in three groups based on population of the city. They have collected opinions of 1900 drivers with the help of questionnaire survey. After the study Anindita Ghosh and Kanika have recommended some suggestion which was grouped in 4 heads Policy and Regulatory Framework, Infrastructural Facilities, Technological up-gradations, Socioeconomic stability of drivers. they have suggested some technological policy measure are, the government needs to provide financial incentives to drivers such as sales tax exemption, interest subsidy on loans, for retrofitting the existing vehicles with latest technologies, State governments should restrict the age of IPT vehicles, Setting up of more CNG/LPG stations, subsidy may be provided by government to the owners of these vehicles, Ride sharing app for IPT needs to be developed for providing the last mile connectivity to commuters.

'Surie Aditi and Jyothikodugant (2016) in their study stated that drivers indicate satisfaction and stability with respect to earnings. This stability and satisfaction is not experienced by traditional drivers who are not associated with Uber or Ola. The drivers associated with these modern and new companies have a changed perception of security and strategies of income like daily intensives which add to their satisfaction level. It is all because of the changing attitude of the drivers towards the modern taxi service in India.

Mr. Sarrepalli sai kalyan kumar and Dr Prakash N.R mohan (2016) studied the current scenario and issues faced by the companies as well as the consumers the main player in the industry. The study says that the innovations of these companies should target basic and comfort demands which will attract the masses. Companies that change according to the needs demands of the consumers will sustain and survive in the market.

**Mr.Pankaj Sharma & Dr.Srinivasan Reddy** (2016) have carried out a study of para-transit system of Alwar and Jaipur cities , Rajasthan , their study was to analyzed the role of para-transit system and identifies the need to recognize and legalese their existence for the benefit of the people of India. They have selected two cities of Rajasthan namely Alwar and Jaipur. They have studied the para-transits mode of transportation in both cities. After the completion of the study they have suggested the policy measures which are listed below

- The government should try to make policies which contemplate the IPT public transport system. Motor Vehicle Act, National Urban Transport Policy, state road and transport policies should be revised to classify IPT. And try to include IPTs while planning for cities or towns.
- 2. Local UIT's, municipal corporations, municipalities should take decisions on IPT regulations. License shall be given and standards laid down by these bodies for unified and integrated mobility.
- 3. IPTs should be planned in such a manner that it acts as a feeder system to other modes like BRTS, metro systems by integrating at different levels. This integration can be possible through route rationalization, infrastructure and design makeovers.
- 4. Implementation of these IPT's should be done by adapting technology by using Android apps and GPS systems. This would help in increasing the efficiency of the

- whole transportation systems and provide better customer satisfaction. The successful cases of IPTs in Alwar and Jaipur have shown that by integrating all the modes, efficiency can be achieved in the system.
- 5. If a very good, coordinated, well-organized feeder system is provided to the Metro, accessibility of metro will increase. JMRC is planning for an integrated ticket. If the integration works out, the same ticket will be valid in metro trains as well as buses. However, this will translate to higher rider-ship only if commuters are willing to accept the added transfer time and transfer costs.

**Aparna Bhatt** examine the political economic that determines the functioning Mumbai's auto rickshaws system look at the various factors involved and interested parties in the system and current issues faced due to the political economy. The paper also examined the validity of the reasons for improving the regulations in the auto rickshaw system and thus for the creation of the political economy.

**Kumar Kishore and Kumar Ramesh** (2016) study that because of the presence of many competitors in the taxi service industry it is important for organisation to motivate consumers who appoints the result of the study states that price conscious consumers redeem coupons the consumers in the time period are modern innovator and price and hence coupon redemption help so customer retention.

Simon E. Harding, Madhav G. Badami, Conor C.O. Reynolds, Milind Kandlikar, (Nov-2016) have carried out a study on Auto-rickshaws in Indian cities, their major objective was to provide balance and nuance to debate, and to enable the perspective of drivers to be more effectively considered, along with that of auto-rickshaw users and the wider travelling public, in policy-making. They have critically discussed the criticism and underlying perceptions; highlight the niche role of auto-rickshaws in urban transport; and present an investigation of the realities and economics of auto-rickshaw ownership and operation. They have first discuss the key criticisms and underlying perceptions related to autorickshaws and their drivers on the part of the public, the media and policy makers, as represented in the English-language press, which reflects and shapes the views of the politically influential urban middle class; public contributions to online discussion forums and online material produced by "civil society" organizations advocating on behalf of both auto-rickshaw. They have conducted an extensive survey of items regarding various issues related to auto-rickshaws (driver behavior, fares and fare regulation and enforcement, air pollution, safety, and traffic congestion) from 2010; in our discussion, in this paper they have highlighted only representative examples which reflect public, media and policy-maker criticisms and perceptions, owing to space restrictions. For their discussion of the role of auto rickshaws in urban transport, they have drawn on the peer reviewed literature, data produced by government agencies and available in the public domain, and research reports produced by non-governmental organizations. Their discussion of the realities and economics of auto-rickshaw ownership and operation was based on the findings of reports on and surveys of the auto-rickshaw sectors in Bangalore, Chennai, Delhi and Mumbai. That survey includes, importantly, that conducted by one of them in Delhi in 2009; In that survey 381 auto-rickshaw drivers responded, covered a wide range of issues, including demographics, working hours and daily travel, vehicle purchase, and ownership and operation besides factors related to air Pollutant emissions. Demographic and socio-economic data was also drawn from surveys carried out by urban planners and researchers interested in the governance of the auto rickshaw sectors in Bangalore, Chennai, Delhi, and Mumbai, and from data collected by a special committee on autorickshaw fare revision in Mumbai. The data was supplemented by interviews with an auto-rickshaw advocacy group in New Delhi (Nyayabhoomi), which provided estimates of how maintenance costs change over the life of the vehicle. With concluding the study they have added, the perceptions of auto-rickshaws and their drivers amongst the middle classes, media, consumer organizations and policy makers are largely negative. The vehicles were seen as polluting, unsafe, and a significant cause of congestion, and the drivers as greedy. Auto-rickshaws are perceived as an intrusion into ordered urban space, to be tamed and controlled with strict policies and punitive penalties.

"Abhishek behl, Paridhi Rathi and V. V Ajith kumar" The study is an attempt to identity the enables to the sustainability of the auto rickshaw sector in India and model them using interpretive structural modelling in order to establish inter relationship among them.

According to "simon E Harding, madha G. Badani, conor co Reynolds, and Millind kandlka" (November 2016) The object of their study is to provide balance and nuance to Debate and enable the perspective of drivers to more effectively considered, Along with that of auto rickshaw users and the wider travelling public in policy making. To the end they highlight the niche role of auto rickshaw in urban transport and present an investigation of the realities and economic of auto rickshaw ownership and operation.

Vaibhav Gaurkar (2016) has carried out a study on systematic organization of para-transit system in context of public transport system in Surat city. In his study he deals with the methodology to be adopted to harmonize the present public transport system and paratransit system to avoid competition and to optimize the urban transport system of Surat city. In his study he has found out the three major problems regarding paratransit system which are absence of planning for auto rickshaw, inadequate parking lots, and heterogeneity in traffic. In the data collection process of his study first he has observed and identified the arterials routes of the Surat city on which the auto-rickshaw and public buses are running, after that he observed the schedule of the buses to find out the feasibility of peak hours and off-peak hours. After that he carried out the house hold survey to find the origin and destination matrix, as well as the socio-economic data like willingness to pay, also to find the various factors like safety and conveniences. After he has carried out the occupancy survey to know the average occupancy of buses and the auto rickshaws. With concluding the study he added that in the absence of effective public bus system in Surat city, the auto rickshaws are serving very well but not efficiently. It needs to be optimized and should be well coordinated with respect to the public buses in terms of fares, routes and frequencies.

**S. Sethuraman** is of the opinion that the informal economics of the auto rickshaw are not just a socio economic problems but a serious ecological concern. This study concentrates on the current socio economic condition of auto rickshaw drivers, the prospects and the

problem encountered by the stake holders and the role of social organization in transferring the lives at large in planning, this study concluded that the cause for stress and the uncongenial behaviour, as voiced and as evident from the research, is related to their financial or economic crunches.

McGregor moira, Brown Barry, maraelike Gloss and AiriLampinen (2016,), in this paper studied the new work life of a set of uber drivers, contrasting this with the existing world of cab drivers. Their goal has been to examine the changing life world of very old profession that of the taxi drivers. There is much controversy ahead concerning broader regulatory policy around on - demand mobility. Balancing the needs of different group of consumers as well as both new and established workers will present considerable challenges to regulator in the future. In an effort to look beyond the changing everyday practices, they concluded with issue regarding labour conditions, surveillance, and exclusion. On -demand services have implications beyond the experiences of those directly involved, and as such, they are not solely a matter of private consumption.

"Khuong mai Ngoc and Dai Ho Quang (2016), researched on the factors affecting customer satisfaction and customer loyalty of taxi companies in Vietnam. The research found for variables which had direct effects on customer loyalty namely reliability, responsiveness, and price and customer satisfaction. In addition there were to variables directly affects customer satisfaction, namely comfort and price. Simultaneously, these variables caused indirect effects on customer loyalty. The study also recommends suggestions to improve customer satisfaction and customer loyalty.


The prevention and control of COVID-19 in megacities is under large pressure because of of millions and high -density populations. The majority of epidemic prevention and control policies implemented focused on travel restrictions, which severely affected urban mobility during the epidemic. Guangyue Nian, Bozhezi peng, and Daniel jian sun are conducted a study on the topic "Impact of covid-19 on urban mobility during post -epidemic period in megacities: From the perspectives of taxi travel and social Vitality "(2020). This study analyzes the relationship between Covid-19, travel of residents, point of interest (POI), and social activities from the perspective of taxi travel. First, changes in the characteristics of taxi trips at different periods were analyzed. Next, the relationship between POIs and taxi travels was established by the Geographic Information System (GIS) method, and the spatial lag model (SLM) was introduced to explore the changes in taxi travel driving force. The results demonstrated that the number of taxi trips dropped sharply, and the travel time, and spatial distribution of taxi trips had been significantly influenced during the epidemic period. Results and models proposed in this study may provide references for the optimization of epidemic control policies and recovery of public transport in megacities during the post -epidemic period.

**Dr Vikram k. and Joshi k. Joshi**"(July 22, 2020) their study evaluates the service quality dimension of ola and urban auto customers is taken for the study. The study used step-wise multiple regression to identity the significant quality dimensions

According to **professor Phil Blyth**, Prof intelligent transport systems New castle and chief scientific advisor of the department for transport (25th 10 2020) the transport industry has been doing a brilliant job keeping public transport COVID sequoia for its workers and passengers throughout the pandemic we need to de per our understanding of kauwa transmission in public transport and keep applying the later science to our work across the network to reduce transmission studies like this one will help you do just that

The study of Emmanuel komla Junior Dzisi and Oscar Akunor Dei on "Adherence to social distancing and wearing of masks within public transportation during the COVID-19 pandemic "(Transportation Research Interdisciplinary perspectives 7, 2020). This study says that, the first two cases of COVID-19 in Ghana were recorded on March 12th 2020.As a guideline, government issued directives on physical distancing and the use of face masks to curb community spread of the disease. Given that public transport has been identified as a high -risk environment for transmission, it was of interest to ascertain user and operator compliance to guidelines for public transport operations during the period, as a measure of its risk level. A roadside observation survey, of over 850 of the most popular paratransit (trotro) buses was carried out on one of the major roads in Kumasi. Compliance to the policy on physical distancing was determined using guidelines from the Ministry of Transport, while compliance to the policy on face mask was determined by the researchers themselves based on the number of commuters with or without face mask per bus. The results suggest that majority (98.0%) of buses comply with the social distancing guidelines established by Ministry of Transport, however the policy of face masks was complied with only partially in most vehicles. About 12.6% of the vehicles had fewer than three commuters without face masks, while 21.3% of buses that had fewer than 3 people with face masks, the results suggests the public transport remains an area of high risk in the fight against COVID-19.

The outbreak of infectious disease affects people's lifestyles significantly, as they under take fewer outdoor activities as a protective measure and to follow government orders of restricted movements. The paper named "Role of Transport during outbreak of Infectious Diseases: Evidence from the past "by **Deepti Muley, Md. Shahin** and **Muhammad Abdullah** (8 September 2020) reviewed the scientific literature related to transport and Infectious Diseases to gain insights into managing such circumstances. They find that no studies were found addressing the short -term or long term impact on transport planning due to the outbreak of Infectious Diseases. Further, a lot of research is required on the transport impacts of post -disease or post -pandemic period, as its severity, spread, and time of infection is considerably long. And they concluded that as the transport sector is badly hit during the outbreak of Infectious diseases, strategies for building resilient transport system need to be developed. Over all, limited studies were found on developing countries, which call for research in all relevant areas.



#### **PROFILE OF STUDY**

### Wayanad


Wayand District - The Green Paradise, (E.Long 75o 47' 23" and 76 o 26' 40" and N.Lat 11 o 30' 08" and 11 o 58' 40"; area of 2132km2) in Malabar is one of the border districts of Kerala, fringing the Mysore plateau to the north east and contiguous with the Nilgris of TamilNadu. It was formed on November 1, 1980 merging North and South Wayanad regions of Kozhikode and Kannur districts.

Wayanad, in the south west edge of the Peninsular shield of India, is distinctly marked by the Department of Town & Country Planning, Kerala western ghats where ground elevations above mean sea level range between 700-2100 m., whereby it is totally contained within the Highland region (Elevation>=750 m) of the state. To its west and north west are districts of Kozhikode and Kannur, while Malappuram district forms the southern perimeter. The district comprises of four blocks, namely Kalpetta, Sulthan Bathery, Mananthavady and Panamaram with 25 grama panchayats. Its head quarter is located at Kalpetta, one of the municipalities and there are 48 villages in three thaluks namely Vythiry, Sultan Bathery and Mananthavady. The land of Wayanad is rich in its cultural tradition and heritage. There is a considerable share of forest land in this district and it accommodates a variety of tourist destinations of the state. Wayanad is the home land of the majority of the tribal population of the state.

#### AREA AND POPULATION

Total area of Wayanad district is 2132 SqKm. As per the 2001 census, the total population of the district is 780619 of which 751007 are rural. The census figures indicate that only 3.79 % of the total population is urban whereas the figure for the state is 26%. Wayanad district stands first in the case of tribal (Adivasi) population among other districts in the state. However it has a large settler population. There are people from almost all parts of Kerala were migrated to this fertile land. Wayanad has a small Jain community consisting of Gowders who came from Karnataka. Almost all sections of Christianity are well represented. One fourth population of Wayanad is constituted by Christians. Muslims constitute another one fourth population and rest of the population belongs to Hindus.

### **POPULATION SIZE**

In 2011, Wayanad had population of 817,420 of which male and female were 401,684 and 415,736 respectively. In 2001 census, Wayanad had a population of 780,619 of which males were 391,273 and remaining 389,346 were females. Wayanad District population constituted 2.45 percent of total Maharashtra population. In 2001 census, this figure for Wayanad District was at 2.45 percent of Maharashtra population.

There was change of 4.71 percent in the population compared to population as per 2001. In the previous census of India 2001, Wayanad District recorded increase of 16.14 percent to its population compared to 1991.

#### **PHYSIOGRAPHY**

Wayanad, in the south west edge of the Peninsular shield of India, is distinctly marked by the Western Ghats where ground elevations above mean sea level range between 700-2100 m., whereby it is totally contained within the Highland region (Elevation>=750 m) of the state. Gross geometry or map view of distribution of arable land in Wayanad is similar to a north west - south east trending shallow-oval bowl with a truncated south east edge. In here, Manathavady and pulpally are along the northern perimeter, whereas Sultan Bathery falls to the eastern edge. Vythiry is due south of Mananthavady in the southern border while Kalpetta is closer to the former but to north east. Yet, based on degree of dissection and distribution of relief features, physiographic divisions, like rugged highland (1400-2100 m), moderately rugged highland (1000-1400 m) and less rugged highland (700- 1000 m) have been identified.

- a. Rugged highland, covering the hill tracts of the west, northwest and southwest, is characteristically made of lofty knobs, ridges and intervening relatively narrow valleys with steeper valley walls and valley floors. But for the patches of grass cover on the summits and immediate flanks, most of this tract is covered by very dense forest.
- **b.** Moderately rugged highland is marked by isolated hills and ridges to the east. Ridges to the southeast marks state border between Kerala and Tamil Nadu. Dominant average slope is of the order of 30%.
- **c.** Less rugged highland. This dominant terrain element of Wayanad (area = 63%), is chiefly made of a more or less rolling topography with hills and

ridges of moderately steep walls or flanks and nearly convex summits bordering relatively flat and wide or occasionally narrow valley floors.

#### SOCIO ECONOMIC ASPECTS

Wayanad is basically agrarian, with plantation economy playing a major role. Of the total 2132 Sq.Km the district has around 40% forest area and around 50% agriculture and plantation area. The district is characterized by perennial plantation crops and spices with coffee forming the main agriculture crop. Coffee is cultivated 66973 hectares. Coffee in the district shares 33.65 per cent of the total cropped area in the district and 78 per cent of the coffee area in the state. Other Major crops are pepper, Coconut, Rubber, Areca nut, Cardamom and ginger. Pepper is grown along with coffee in the north eastern parts of the district, especially in pulpally and Mullankolly. Paddy, once the major crop of the District, is now cultivated in 12988 H and only a single crop is harvested. Much of the paddy field of the district is being converted for banana cultivation. Ginger cultivation in Wayanad has also substantially increased in recent times and paddy fields are increasingly being converted for ginger cultivation. The district does not have any significant industry. Wayanad is a backward area in the industrial map of Kerala and there is no major industrial unit in the district worth mentioning except a few factories for processing tea and coffee. Though there are high potential for the processing of local agriculture produces, there is no significant processing units in the district. Animal husbandry is another major area contributes to the economy of wayanad. Dairy is a subsidiary economic activity for a significant section of the population of the district. Kerala Agriculture University has set up a veterinary college in Lakkidi.

### **Literacy Rate:**

The average literacy rate of the district is 82.73% in 1991, comparatively lower than state average of 90.86%. According to 2001 senses, the literacy rate of district is 85.25% and that of Kalpetta municipality is 76.92%.

#### **CORONA & WAYANAD**

During mid December 2019, a cluster of pneumonia cases due to unknown cause was reported from Wuhan city, Hubei province of China. This was later identified as a Novel Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) which subsequently escalated to involve more than 200 countries worldwide. On 30th January 2020, WHO announced that the COVID-19 outbreak was a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC), and on March 11, 2020 it was declared as a PANDEMIC. First case of COVID-19 in India was reported in Kerala on 30.1.2020 in a student who returned from Wuhan. Government of Kerala initiated outbreak response activities promptly and all the districts were alerted to take up necessary measures for containment of the disease. Government of India declared lockdown for 21 days with effect from March 24, 2020. Kerala Government has enforced 144 in all districts to

fight the disease and declared the COVID-19 as state disaster. Wayanad District administration closed all the borders except for essential commodities and thorough checking has been enforced in all district borders. COVID-19 is an acute respiratory illness caused by SARS-CoV-2 virus that predominantly affects the lungs; based on current evidence, this virus is transmitted between people through droplets, omits and close contact. As this is a new virus whose source and disease progression are not clearly identified yet, more precautions have to be taken to fight the disease. These operational guidelines are prepared considering the requirement and availability of facilities in the district. The advisories issued by the Central and State Governments, WHO and different departments of the state are considered. Specific needs of the tribal population, transgender people, differently abled, migrant labourers, children, women and elderly are looked into and peculiar geo climatic nature of the district is specifically considered while preparing this operational guidelines.

The District Emergency Operating Centre (DEOC) acts as the control room for coordinating all the activities in the district. It will act as the COVID Cell. The Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for the DEOC is as follows:

- 1. The DEOC will function for 24 hours in two shifts.
- 2. Staff from health, revenue Fire, Police and officials deployed by the Chairperson, District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) will function in the DEOC. The Inter Agency Group (IAG) coordinator and the Hazard Analyst will be part of the DEOC.
- 3. Dedicated telephone lines for call centre activities, and logistics like computers, printers, mobiles, Television, Storage facility for gloves, masks, sanitizers, and other items be arranged attached to the DEOC.
- 4. A dedicated Disaster Management (DM) section is attached to the DEOC.
- 5. All proceedings and orders will be issued from DEOC with the assistance of the disaster management section on behalf of the DDMA.

- 6. The DEOC have to scrutiny all the draft orders given by all the other departments in connection to COVID-19, and submit to the Chairperson, DDMA.
- 7. The DEOC will coordinate the tracking of COVID-19 positive patients in association with Integrated Disease Surveillance Program (IDSP) unit.
- 8. The DEOC will coordinate all the other control lines established in the district.
- 9. The Deputy Collector (DM) will be the nodal officer for DEOC.

A district level team was formed with the following members to monitor all activities in the district and disseminate necessary orders and guidelines as and when required.

- 1. District Collector
- 2. District panchayat president
- 3. District Medical Officer
- 4. District Police Chief
- 5. Deputy collector(DM)

The Minister in charge, MP and MLAs contributed with help and guidance as and when necessary. The different departments were given specific responsibilities to fight COVID 19.

#### **Prevention of community spread**

Various restrictions were imposed in the district to prevent community spread and if ever it happens to flatten its epidemiological curve. The Information, Education and Communication activities are intensified to create awareness about the spread of the disease and the safety measures to be taken. The measures taken are

- Restrictions on get together, marriages, worship and other social gatherings limiting the number earlier to 10-15, later to maximum five
- Restrictions on office functioning, reducing attendances in offices.
- Offices which are declared as Essential services only to function
- Break the Chain campaign to spread necessity of hand wash
- Hand wash protocols made available through media and social media
- Mask usage protocol and IEC on this.
- Kudumbashree entrusted to make reusable masks, and to make masks as per WHO guidelines.
- NGOs like Doctors for You came forward to help in supply of materials.
- During lockdown thorough checking to discourage unnecessary travel and to enforce CrPC.144.

### **CONTROLLING INFLOW:**

As the main focus is to prevent community spread the following measures are taken to control the inflow

a) Before the Lockdown


- Surveillance enhanced at state borders- team of health workers, police, revenue, excise, forest, Motor Vehicles Department, teachers and volunteers were deployed at border points and passengers were tested for health issues. Thermal scanners were used to measure body temperature. Those with fever and health issues were asked to report the matter to the health centers.
- ➤ All passengers from other states were advised for home quarantine.
- ➤ All travellers from foreign countries were home quarantined.
- ➤ All symptomatic were managed as per existing protocol.
- ➤ Hotels, Resorts and Home stays were asked to shut down and handover keys to LSGs. This was with two intentions
  - To prevent foreign returnees from staying in them
  - To use these facilities as COVID Care Centres (CCC)


### b) During Lockdown

- > State and District border checking intensified. Only persons with genuine reasons were allowed to enter the district.
- All those who came from other districts and other states were either admitted to COVID Care Centres or kept in home quarantine.
- > No persons were allowed to travel within and from the district without proper reasons. No one from declared hot spots was allowed to enter the district.
- Passes were issued to the persons who have to travel in unavoidable circumstances.
- Essential commodity movement was ensured.
- The officials, health workers and volunteers were given guidelines on health safety.
- > The drivers, cleaners and others who have to travel for essential services were trained on health safety measures. Notices were prepared and circulated

#### DATA ANALYSIS AND INTERPRETATION


Data analysis is the process of systematically applying statistical and/ or logical technique to describe and illustrate condense and recap, and evaluate data. According to Shyamu and Resnick (2003) various analytics procedure "provides a way of drawing inductive inference from data and distinguishing the signal (the phenomenon of interest) from the noise (statistical functions) present in the data.

"Impact of COVID-19 on taxi sector (auto taxi, car taxi) with special reference to wayanad district". The data was collected from 50 samples in wayanad district. 





































### **FINDINGS**


- The survey reveals that almost all drivers are less satisfied with their occupation and taxi rates in pandemic situation

- ➤ In the present study majority of drivers are owner drivers.
- ➤ The study says that before covid-19 majority of respondents (34%) are earning income level between 10000-15000 and there is no drivers earn income from above 15000 after covid.
- There is 64% of drivers were taken taxi loans and 36% drivers were not
- In this study says that during covid-19 situation 16% drivers have the repayment of loans and 84% have not.
- ➤ Before the covid-19 situation majority of (50%) workers works in between 5-10 hours and 14% of workers works below 5 hours in.
- The main problem faced by the drivers during covid-19, 90% of respondents faced the problem that economic crisis. Only 6% respondents faced mental strain.

### **SUGGESTIONS**

- 1. Reduce petrol and diesel prices to get minimum profit for auto rickshaw and car taxi drivers during COVID period.
- 2. Provide net banking facilities in auto rickshaw and car taxi sector.
- 3. Government must provide financial assistant to improve the standard of living of drivers during COVID pandemic.
- 4. Increase fares in a way that does not cause inconvenience to passengers.
- 5. Implement prepaid taxi system.
- 6. Government should ensure that thru finance company does not force the driver to repay the vehicle loans instalment on COVID pandemic.
- 7. Implement mobile app more efficiently for calling taxi.
- 8. Concession should be given for loan taken by auto rickshaw and car taxi drivers during COVID pandemic.

### **CONCLUSIONS**



With this, the people stayed at home. After the lockdown, everyone started travelling in their own vehicles. With this, public transport almost stopped. This has wiped out the financial resources of many to some Covid-19 every public transport in Wayanad district was affected in many ways. Despite this situation, not every taxi or auto taxi worker has stayed from the path of survival because that occupation is their livelihood. They took some precautions to prevent Covid-19 to some extent. Workers encountered Covid-19 by washing their hands with soap, using a sanitizer and keeping a social distance and wearing a mask.
