# REPORT ON THE FEEDBACK OF TEACHERS ON CURRICULUM 

## 2021-22

Satisfaction of teachers on the curriculum to teach students must be considered for better revisions in the curriculum in the future. The present study thus covers the feedback of teachers on the curriculum. For this, a questionnaire is designed by the experts of IQAC team and collected the response through a google form shared through Whats App Group. The factors considered for the study are syllabus covers basic as well as advanced topics for subjects, the syllabus specified adequate books for reference, the syllabus can be comfortably covered and delivered, the syllabus provides room for participatory learning, weightage provided for each component for internal assessment, curriculum highlights value based learning, the curriculum helps in the overall development of the student, and The course outcome, program outcome, program-specific outcome specified for the curriculum is attainable and suitability of curriculum. As it is aided college, the development of curriculum is within the control of University of Calicut. But still conducting a study helps the teachers to express their opinion on the syndicate meeting for discussing about the revision of curriculum when university calls for.

The mean score and standard deviation of each parameter is inspected to know the average perception of each factor and from there overall mean score of satisfaction of teachers on the curriculum is also assessed.

The mean score on each factor explains that teachers are mostly satisfied with the weightage provided for each component for internal assessment and least with the space provided for participatory learning for students. The overall mean score of satisfaction stood at 3.91. The standard deviation of each factor lies close to zero for each factor indicating a consistent opinion.

## REPORT ON THE FEEDBACK OF STUDENTS ON CURRICULUM

## 2021-22

Students are the ultimate stakeholders who gets benefit on the curriculum prepared by the University. Hence, the college seeks to know the satisfaction of students to know whether the curriculum serves the purpose and objectives of students. This study thus aims to focus on the satisfaction of students on the curriculum. But as it is an aided college, the revision of curriculum is not within the control of college because it is within the control of university Still the study move ahead with testing the satisfaction of the students on the curriculum planned in the hope of able to give suggestion during the time of gathering syndicate meeting to revise the curriculum or syllabus and those suggestions will be implemented. The factors considered in the study are about syllabus covering the basic features of subject, specification of adequate books in the reference of syllabus, option given in the curriculum to choose open course and language, option given in the curriculum to elect elective subjects in the semester according to their wish, adequate time to cover the syllabus, opportunity given in the curriculum for participatory learning, suitability for placement/industry opportunities, curriculum provides value learning, helps in overall development of students, willingness given by students to recommend this course to others.

All these factors are tested on a five point likert scale and an average score is computed based on the above factors. The study used average to find out the mean satisfaction on the parameters discussed above and standard deviation score to know whether there is any difference in the opinion among students. To test this a structured questionnaire is designed on the above said parameters in a google form and shared it to students through Whats App Group. The results of the test is showed in table given below.

The mean score on each factor shows that students are most satisfied on the factor option given to the students in choosing second language and electives in a semester. The least score given by the students is on the factor suitability of curriculum for placement. The overall mean score of satisfaction stood at 3.56. The standard deviation of each factor lies close to zero in all the factors which indicates a consistent opinion among all.

The mean score of the factors tested shows highest influenced factor is the college provides opportunities for holistic development of the student by way of activities of Arts club, sports and games associations, clubs, NSS, NCC etc which stood at 4.01. The second most influential factor is syllabus is need-based with respect to recent advancements 3.86. The third most influential factor is the effectiveness of the curriculum in developing innovative thinking. The least influential factor is the curriculum is suitable for placement/industry opportunities. The second least influential factor is the effectiveness of the curriculum for entrepreneurship. The curriculum helps graduates to contribute to society in an ethical manner.
