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

## A BRIEF HISTORY OF ST. MARY'S COLLEGE

The first College of higher education in India was started in the Seminary of Malankara (Indian) Orthodox Syrian Church at Kottayam in Kerala in the year 1815. St. Mary's College, Sulthan Bathery is a premier institution of the Malankara (Indian) Orthodox Syrian Church. It is the first institution of Higher Education in the District of Wayanad. St. Mary's College, Sulthan Bathery is named after Saint Mary, or Mother Mary the Mother of Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus of Nazareth had many disciples. Saint Thomas, one among them, was sent to the eastern lands including India. He is believed to have established the Church in Kerala in 52 AD. The supreme head of Church, His Holiness the Catholicos holds the titular position to the 'Throne of Saint Thomas' and is the 91st Prelate to the throne.

It was a long-cherished dream of His Holiness, the Catholicos, to start a centre of higher learning in the northern region of Kerala. In the year 1963, in the times of Catholicose designate His Grace Augen Mar Thimothios, an application was sent to the Government of Kerala for permission to start an institution of Higher Education. His Holiness was armed with the provision of 250 acres of land elsewhere and the expected philanthropy of a prominent family of the Church. However, it did not happen.

In the meantime, His Holiness Baselios Augen Ist, the Catholicos wrote to the Secretary of Malabar Diocese Sri. M. C. Pothen Manamel, a renowned planter in the region. He responded, "I would suggest that Your Holiness write to Father Mathai Nooranal about this matter". The opportunity was knocking at the door of Wayanad. With no land, no building and no clue of any source of funding, Fr. Mathai Nooranal took up the challenge at the young age of 37. An ad hoc Committee was formed with Fr. Mathai Nooranal as Chairman and Sri. M. C. Pothen Manamel as Secretary.

Fr. Mathai Nooranal inaugurated the College on Ist July 1965. Sri. K. M. Cherian Kandathil and Sri. K. M. Mathew Kandathil, both Chief Editors of Malayala Manorama were pillars of strength for Fr. Mathai Nooranal during the foundation of the college as well during the significant years of its development. Fr. Mathai Nooranal held the office of the Secretary of Governing Board till his demise on the 29th of November, 2002. His Grace Thomas Mar Thimothios, the newly



appointed Metropolitan of Malabar Diocese graced the office of the President of Governing Board from 1967 to 1991. His Grace Kuriakose Mar Clemis, Bishop of the Sulthan Bathery Diocese had been the President from 1991 to 2009. His Grace Abraham Mar Epiphanios, Bishop of Sulthan Bathery Diocese assumed charge as the President, Governing Board and Manager with powers of the treasury in April 2009. Sri. M. C. Pothen was the treasurer till his demise in 1993. Sri. Jacob Mathew Kandathil, Director and Executive Editor of Malayala Manorama remained in the office of the Treasurer from 1993 to 2003. From 2003 onwards, CA George Mathai Nooranal, son of Fr. Mathai Nooranal functions as the Secretary of Governing Board.

In 1965, the College had been affiliated to the University of Kerala and when the University of Calicut came into existence in 1968, ipso facto, the College got affiliated to it. The College was upgraded as a first-grade college in 1970 and as a post-graduate college in 1984. Currently, the College has eleven undergraduate and eight post-graduate departments. The College is accredited with Grade 'A' by National Assessment and Accreditation Council, New Delhi.



#### Post Script:-

History would have us to take note that in spite of the government sanction, 250 acres of land and the promise of funding by a family, a college did not happen elsewhere; but it did happen in Wayanad in 1965 in spite of having no land and no source of funding. It is ironic; truth is stranger than fiction, often.

### OTHER PROGRAMMES

### Centre For Continuing Education Kerala - DCA Programme

St. Mary's College is selected as a sub-centre for conducting Diploma in Computer Application by Centre for Continuing Education-Kerala, a venture of the Kerala Govt. The minimum qualification to enrol the programme is SSLC. UG and PG Students and employees can also enrol in the programme. The duration of the course is six months and a fee of Rs.6000/ is charged for general category and Rs.3000/ for the reservation category. The fee can be paid in three instalments. The classes are arranged in the morning and evening, and on Saturdays and Sundays. The certificate issued after the completion of the course by the Govt. of Kerala is valid for PSC and govt. jobs. The syllabus of the course is very simple and will cover all the basic information related to computer. The certificate holders of this course have an upper hand in the PSC jobs, where IT knowledge is mandatory.

### Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP)

Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP) is a novel initiative of the Department of Higher Education, Kerala to promote skills in students. The programme commenced during November 2012, aims at giving training to selected final year degree and PG students from various colleges in the state. The selected students are given special training in Communicative Language Teaching and IT skills as part of 21 days long residential training camps. The purpose of conducting such camps is to select Skill Development Executives (SDEs). The college is an SDE training centre of ASAP. Two residential camps were held in the college in 2013 and one in 2014. The regular skill training programme of ASAP for the first year and second year degree students is also held in the college.

# Walk With the Scholar Programme (WWSP)

Walk With a Scholar (WWS) scheme proposes to arrange specialized mentoring programmes for students in Under Graduate Programs in Arts, Science and Commerce and to provide guidance for their future. The mentoring scheme for students will be purely voluntary in nature. It is open for all students entering the first year of the Under Graduate Programme of Study.

## Indira Gandhi National Open University IGNOU

The Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) has a study centre in the College. The centre has produced a large number of graduates and postgraduates over the years.

The library has more than 38600 books, 67 periodicals, 32 peer-reviewed Journals, 35 general magazines, 10 dailies (4 English and 6 Malayalam) and a collection of back volumes. Library documents are classified with DDC and automated with in-house software. The library is a registered member of INFLIBNET's N-LIST programme.

The girls' hostels are managed by nuns and the boys' hostel by teachers. Hostel accommodation is provided for both deserving boys and girls.



# Co-operative Book Stall: Books & Stationery Store

The College maintains books and stationery stall in the basement of North Block. The Store is constituted as a cooperative society under an Act of Government of Kerala.

#### Cafeteria

The college maintains a Cafeteria near the West Block which is called Canteen and is open for normal working hours of the college and serves Vegetarian and Non-Vegetarian Breakfast, Lunch and Snacks in subsidized rates.

# **Medical Inspection**

Every student has to undergo medical inspection once during the course. A report on the result of the medical inspection shall be forwarded to the University. Where a medical certificate has to be produced by the student such certificates should be obtained from either the college doctor or from some other doctors approved by the Principal.

#### **Health & Fitness Club**

The Health and Fitness Club in the college provides the following facilities.

## Gymnasium

The college maintains a gymnasium close to the open grounds. It is particularly open to the students and staff in the morning and evening hours. Partly funded by the UGC, the gymnasium is equipped with all modern machinery for bodybuilding and exercise.

## The College Union

The college union aims at training the students to be worthy citizens. It also provides an avenue for the fullest expression of the artistic and literary talents in students. Every year the various office bearers are elected along strictly democratic lines as decided by the Management. All the co-curricular activities of the college are conducted under the auspices of the college union. The culmination of all these is marked by the annual magazine brought out every year.

# National Cadet Corps (N.C.C.)

The college provides facilities for N.C.C. training for both men and women. It is purely voluntary. Cadets are selected at the beginning



of the academic year by the N.C.C. Officers in consultation with the Principal. Members of corps will be subject to the rules and regulation of N.C.C.

### **National Service Scheme (N.S.S.)**

Under the supervision of the University of Calicut, 2 units of the National Service Scheme are functioning in this college. These units have about 200 volunteers on the roll. They are properly educated & trained for social work.

### **College Journal (Marian)**

In addition to the college magazine, a journal with the title "Marian" is published every year. The Journal will contain articles collected from students and staff and information related to the activities of the college.

The College publishes an annual Magazine under the Chief editorship of the Principal. It generally contains literary works, general articles and a glimpse of the activities of the year besides the college Annual Report.

# **Poly House Organic Farm**

The college maintains an excellent climate-controlled Poly House Farm. The produces include Carrot, Cabbage, tomato, Chillies, Cucumber, Broccoli, Lettuce and the like. The vegetables are mostly consumed in the Hostels. The excess production is sold to Organic Shops. The members of the general public are encouraged to purchase directly from the farm, at a subsidized rate, if they wish so.



### Milk Dairy

Attached to the Hostels is the auxiliary facility of a dairy. Most of the livestock are of high-yielding hybrid varieties. However, there are a few low-yielding ethnic varieties that produce milk with medicinal properties. The dairy is organic in nature. The dairy is helpful in maintaining a Bio Gas Plant. The produced milk is consumed in the hostels. The gas from the biogas plant is consumed at hostels.

# The Open Organic Farm

Close to the women's hostel is the Open Organic Farm. Seasonal vegetables are grown in the open farm. The method of farming is fully organic in nature. The products are mainly consumed in the Hostels.

# College Chaplain

By virtue of being a recognized minority certified institution, the management has decided that there shall be a Chaplain to oversee the spiritual well-being of all interested students.

# Free Noon Meal Programme

The college has instituted the Free Midday Meal Programme for some of the selected students who can exchange a coupon at the College Canteen for a full meal on all days. The funds for the programme are raised by students, staff and well-wishers.

# **Rainwater Harvest System**

The Rainwater Harvest System in the college consists of three 2 lakh litre collection tanks and additional open tank which would help water to sweep down into the soil. Together, it provides 10,00,000 litre capacity of rainwater harvesting.

### **Volleyball Academy**

The Volleyball Academy in the St. Mary's College Higher Secondary School has a Sports Hostel exclusively for girls with the aid of Sports Department of Government of Kerala. It has made many commendable achievements over the years. It has produced many national and international players since its inception in 2004.

### **Counselling Centre**

The Centre was established in 2004 with the help of some well-wishers. Since then, the college could make use of the service of the reverend priests of the church from time to time. Once the Tutorial



system was strengthened by the University and by the college, it obviated the need for a separate counselling centre as the tutor could handle most of the issues. There are occasional visits by Professional Counsellors.

### **Women Development Cell**

A Women Development Cell has been functioning in the college. The Cell aims at developing the living standard of women especially, in the lower strata of society and among Adivasis.

## **Parent-Teacher Association (PTA)**

A Parent-Teacher Association is functioning in the college with the main objective of promoting good relationship and interaction among the members of the teaching staff, students and parents of students.

#### M.G.O.C.S.M.

A unit of M.G.O.C.S.M. is functioning in the college. The main objective of the Association is to promote the spiritual and religious interests of the Orthodox Syrian Church students of the College. The meetings and activities of the M.G.O.C.S.M. involve all interested students.

#### **Alumni Association**

The purpose of the Association is to foster and perpetuate friendship, contact and co-operation among the alumni. The Association seeks to further social, literary and cultural interests of the college by maintaining an active channel of communication between the college and the alumni. Every student who is seeking T.C. should remit an amount of Rs. 50/- as membership fee.





### **ENDOWMENTS & AWARDS**

The college has instituted endowment prizes to support brilliant students hailing from economically unsound background. The endowments are sponsored by the former members of the staff.

- 1. Fr. Mathai Nooranal Endowment: The Governing Board of St. Mary's College has initiated an endowment of Rs. 25,00,000 (Rupees Twenty-Five Lakhs) in the year 2015 as a part of the Golden Jubilee Celebrations of the College. The endowment is named after Rev. Fr. Mathai Nooranal, the Founder of the College and had been inaugurated by His Holiness Baselios Poulose II, Catholicose of the East and Educational agency of the College. The amount equivalent to the yearly interest of the endowment would be awarded to the meritorious student or students of St. Mary's College or St. Mary's College Higher Secondary School on a merit cum means basis.
- **2. H.H. Baselios Didymus-I Scholarship**: It is instituted by former Principal, Prof. Sunny Mathew as a token of his gratitude, commitment and devotion to H.H. Baselios Didiymous I, the former manager of St. Mary's College. The annual interest on the endowment amount of Rs.50,000 will be distributed equally among two students (one each from second year B. Com and BBA selected by the faculty members of commerce department on the basis of academic and non-academic performances, character and conduct and economic conditions.)
- **3.Prof. P. Sam Kurian Memorial Endowment Prize**: Annual interest on Rs. 1000/-. The prize will be awarded to the student who secures the highest mark in the final year B.A. Economics (Main) University examination every year.

Avira Memorial Endowment Prize**: Annual interest on Rs. 10,000/-The prize will be awarded to a Final Year B.A. Political Science student of this college who secures the highest marks in the University examination of B. A. Political Science, held by the University of Calicut every year.
- **10. Prof. Thomas Thevara Endowment Prize**: Annual interest on Rs. 10,000/-. The prize will be awarded to a Final Year B.Sc. Chemistry student of this college who secures the highest marks in the University examination of B.Sc. Chemistry held by the University of Calicut every year.
- 11. Prof. James Kurian Endowment Prize: Annual interest on Rs. 10,000/. The prize will be awarded to a Final Year B.A. Political Science girl student of this college who secures the highest marks in the University examination of B. A. Political Science held by the University of Calicut every year.

#### **Caution Deposit:**

a. a. Every student on admission shall be liable to pay caution deposit at the rates shown below along with the first instalment of Tuition fee and other special fees.

B.Sc./B.A./B.Com/BCA/BBA Rs. 360

M.A./ M.Sc./M.Com. Rs. 600

- b. At the end of the particular course of study two or three years as the case may be, the caution deposit will be refunded to them on receipt of application from students in the prescribed form along with original receipt for the remittance of caution deposit, and after adjusting the dues, if any, on account of
  - 1. Loss of Library books.
  - 2. Recovery of fine or breakage of laboratory equipment and
  - 3. Any other loss caused to the properties of the college.

If the caution deposit is less than the amount to be exacted from the students, the balance amount will be collected by other means as the Principal may decide.

- c. If any student leaves the college or discontinues with the course of study his/her caution deposit shall be refunded after adjusting dues within one year from the date of completion of the final year class.
- d. If the caution deposit money is not claimed within one year after the completion of the course a notification to this effect will be published in a daily and such amount will be forfeited & remitted to the Govt. A/c.

#### **Rules for Collection of Fees**

- 1. Tuition fee and special fee will be collected on the date of admission from the B.A, B.Sc, B.Com, BBA, BCA & P.G. students. Second and final year students shall remit the tuition fee and special fee with in a period of seven consecutive working days beginning from the reopening of the college.
- 2. Tuition fee can also be remitted in 2 term basis commencing from June to February on or before the 7th consecutive working day of the concerned term.
- 3. If any student fails to pay tuition or special fee on the due date, he/she shall be liable to pay a fine of Rs. 5/- along with the fees on or



before the seventh day after the due date and thereafter for 7 days at the rate of Rs. 10/-. A re-admission fee of Rs. 50/- is to be remitted after the due date with fine of Rs. 10/-

- 4. Consequences of non-payment of fees.
  - If the fees or special fees with the fine of Rs. 5/- is not paid on or before the last date fixed for the fine of Rs.5/-, an additional fine of rupees 5/- shall be paid. If the fees and fines of an instalment are not paid before the last opportunity given for payment of the instalment the name of the student shall be removed from the rolls of the college with effect from the date following the expiry of this period and student shall not get the benefit of attendance from the date of removal from the rolls of the college. If the student is to be re-admitted he/she has to apply for the special permission of the Principal with a re-admission fee of Rs. 50/- and also has to remit all the arrears of fees with fine. The re-admitted student shall get the benefit of attendance only from the date of re-admission.
- 5. If a student fails to settle all the dues to the college on or before the last date prescribed, he/she will not be allowed to write the University Examination or promoted to the higher class as the case may be.
- 6. Students belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and certain other communities are eligible for full fee concession and stipend provided they submit application online and furnish the printout along with the relevant documents at the office.
- 7. Students desirous of discontinuing their studies should inform the Principal in writing with the recommendation of the guardian so as to get their names removed from the rolls and get exemption from the payment of tuition fee for the remaining terms. No Transfer Certificate will be issued to those students who are to pay dues to the college.
- 8. Students of other backward communities as per the list published by the Harijan Welfare Department are eligible for full fee concession. They will have to produce the nativity and income certificate from the Village Officer in the prescribed form.

The income limit for the above concession:

Degree and P.G. Classes Rs. 1,00,000 per annum.



1. Time of collection of fees: Fees will be collected in the office on the due date during the following hours. Fore-noon - 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon After -noon - 1:30 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.

While remitting the tuition fee for the IInd instalment, the receipt of the previous instalment paid should be produced.

#### **Examinations / Promotions**

- 1. There shall be two internal examinations each semester. Besides test papers will be held regularly.
- 2. Students are not allowed to absent themselves from any of these examinations and test papers.
- 3. Promotion and selection of the candidates for writing the university examinations will be made by the College Council on the basis of the result of the terminal examinations, on the record of the year's work and conduct of the student. The council decision is final.



#### GENERAL DISCIPLINE

#### **Preamble:**

St. Mary's College, Sulthan Bathery is a missionary endeavor of the Malankara (Indian) Orthodox Syrian Church. The Church respects the basic ethos of rule of law and the fundamentals of a secular and democratic society. These values shall be reflected in the code and conduct of the institution also. Hence these rules and regulations are formed.

#### **Introduction:**

The following rules apply in matters of general discipline. These rules are supplemented with occasional directions from the Principal and the College Council and the Departments from time to time which shall be either announced, published in the official website or shall be displayed on the notice board.

#### **General Rules**

- 1. All students shall abide by the decisions and directions of the Principal, the College Council, the respective Department and the consultative & disciplinary committees. Ignorance of rules is not an excuse for breaking the rule. All disputes arising out of this shall be settled as per the directions of the University and shall be under the jurisdiction of a court in Sulthan Bathery.
- 2. Attendance shall be provided only to those students who are present in class or lab in time meeting all requirements prescribed by word of mouth or in writing by the Department, Principal or College Council like writing instruments, prescribed texts, note books, assignments, projects, Observation Books, Record Books, lab necessities etc., as the case may be. Students who do not meet the respective requirements shall not be allowed to attend lab/ class. Students reporting late to the class/lab may not be allowed to enter class/lab and shall not receive attendance. Students causing disturbances in the class are liable to be evicted from the class with or without cancellation of attendance.
- 3. Students should be dressed moderately and properly.
- 4. No posters or writings other than official are permitted inside the campus.
- 5. Destroying, disfiguring displacing, or causing damages to the college properties including roads and grounds are punishable offences. The cost of repainting, restoring, replacing or repairing the item to its original state shall be charged on the offender/s at the time of issuing TC or earlier apart from fine.



- 6. Littering and spitting in the campus are offences. The cost of cleaning up will be charged on the offender.
- 7. No flag or such other materials of student organisations shall be hoisted or used in the college campus. The cost of cleaning up will be charged on the offender/s.
- 8. It is mandatory for all students to wear their ID tag distributed from the college. Students without ID tags will be fined and will not be allowed to enter the campus.
- 9. Students are not permitted to loiter in the college campus during class hours.
- 10. Smoking in the campus is strictly prohibited.
- 11. The use of two wheelers by students within the campus is strictly prohibited according to the Government orders.
- 12. Public use of Mobile Phone is prohibited in the class and in the campus.
- 13. Any student found intoxicated by consuming beverages, drugs etc. will be summarily dismissed from the college.
- 14. Outsiders are not permitted to meet any of the staff or student in the college campus without the permission of the Principal.
- 15. Students are not permitted to indulge in any political activities in the college campus. Students are also prohibited from organising or attending meetings other than the official ones.
- 16. Prior permission of the Principal, in writing, is necessary for:
- organising processions, special meetings, entertainments or special functions in the college or college premises.
- collecting funds from the students or from the staff.
- 17. Indecent behaviour, especially towards the opposite sex, will not be tolerated.
- 18. As per High Court order on writ appeal No.535/2003 and judgement on review petition dated 20th Feb. 2004 all strikes, demonstrations, agitations, dharnas, gherao and the like are banned in the college campus. Students who violate the above rules are liable to be dismissed from the college summarily.
- 19. Political activities are completely banned in the college campus. Students indulging in and involving themselves in any kind of political activity in the college campus are liable to be summarily dismissed from the college.
- 20. No student shall bring into the college campus any banner, flag, board, notice, pamphlet or other such material for the purpose of



- any political activity. If any student violates this, he/she will be summarily dismissed from the college.
- 21. No student shall indulge in any activity which may cause disruption to classes or disturbance in the college campus. If any student violates the above regulation, he/she is liable to be dismissed from the college summarily.
- 22. Ragging/teasing/harassing/ using words of abuse/etc. on junior students, especially female students, within the campus or outside is a punishable crime under police act and such matter will be immediately reported to the police. Students involved in such acts will be adequately punished which amounts to:-
- Imprisonment upto 2 years and
- A fine upto Rs. 10,000/- and
- Dismissal from the college
- 23. The authority of the Principal extends outside also in matters related to the institution.
- 24. Notice signed or countersigned by the Principal and published on the notice boards should be considered as having been brought to the notice of the students of the college.
- 25. An office bearer will lose the office if he/she is found guilty of indiscipline or misusing his/her office.
- 26. Any student or group of students in the name of strike or agitation cannot disturb class or cannot prevent the staff or the Principal from carrying out their duties. Stringent disciplinary action including dismissal will be taken against such students. If the college canteen incurs any loss due to the above mentioned activities of students, they will be held responsible for that and they are liable to compensate the loss.
- 27. The Principal shall place himself/herself in communication with parents or guardians of the students who are very backward in their studies and do not show any improvement and where attendance is very irregular or conduct unsatisfactory. If the parents or guardians do not respond or do not take any interest in such matters the Principal will take appropriate action.
- 28. The Principal in consultation with the college council wherever required, may impose the following or other punishments as may be deemed necessary.
- Fines
- Cancellation of attendance
- Withholding of term certificates



- Forfeit of educational concession and scholarship
- Suspension
- Expulsion.
- 29. If a student or a group of students or the entire students have grievances of any kind whatsoever, it should be brought to the attention of the Grievance Redressal Cell in writing. All complaints (staff as well as students) shall be addressed to the Chairman of the respective Grievance Redressal Cell. The GRCs generally follow the formal procedural pattern of Internal Complaints Committee.
- 30. Study tour will be permitted only in cases where a tour report is necessary for appearing for University Examinations, and it is limited to two or three days. A lady teacher must compulsorily accompany the tour team.
- 31. College Campus, Examination Rooms, Library, Research Centers, verandahs and the offices are kept under CCTV recording. In case of an untoward incident like theft, violence or destruction of property the recordings shall be checked.
- 32. Any matter which is not covered by the foregoing rules shall be decided by the Principal.

#### **Ragging Prevention**

- 33. Ragging is totally prohibited in the campus. If any student is found indulging in ragging, severe action will be taken against the student.
- 34. Based on the Honourable Supreme Court of India's direction, the UGC has issued Regulations and Guidelines (UGC 2009 Regulations).

### **What Constitutes Ragging**

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- 1. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- 3. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- 4. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the



- regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- 5. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- 6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- 7. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- 8. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- 9. Any act that affects the mental health and self- confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

### Administrative Action in the Event of Ragging

- 1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- 2. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
- 3. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- 4. Withholding results.
- 5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or International meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- 6. Suspension/Expulsion from the hostel.
- 7. Cancellation of admission.
- 8. Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to two years.
- 9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. College has an active anti- ragging Committee with Dr. Pramod K. S. as the nodal officer.

#### **Prevention of Caste Based Discrimination**

10. This campus, by the principles of institution as well as by the policies of functioning is against every and all practices which would directly or indirectly promote, support or sustain cast-based discrimination



of any kind. The institution by virtue of its constitution is committed to implement and follow all and every rule and regulation by the government against caste-based discrimination.

#### Students' Union Election

- 1. Students must follow the code of conduct for union election.
- 2. Students shall not participate in election with political affiliation.
- 3. Election work/propaganda/campaign will be permitted only after the publication of the final list of candidates contesting the election.
- 4. No other organisation work/election work will be permitted in the campus in the form of membership campaign, issuing membership to the students' organisations which are politically affiliated.
- 5. Hoisting flags of political parties, display of banners and wall posters etc. within the campus are also banned.
- 6. No flag will be allowed in the campus during any time of the academic year.
- 7. Expensive election materials like banners, big notices etc. will not be permitted during election campaign.
- 8. No outsider including students who have been temporarily removed from the rolls of the college will be permitted to enter the campus for any work connected with the union election.
- 9. Students should desist from disfiguring any class rooms, compound walls and building in the college campus by pasting of posters or writing on the walls or on the roads or electric / telephone posts as part of their election campaign. They should not disfigure the compound walls of the neighbouring buildings.
- 10. Election campaign / propaganda in the college campus should be limited to the issue of pamphlets and bit notices.
- 11. Students should not arrange for election propaganda / campaign in the college campus during the working hours.
- 12. No meeting or other election activity shall be arranged inside the college campus without the approval of the Principal.

### **Library Rules and Regulations**

- The Library is open from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm on all working days.
- The students must carry their identity card with him/her to get in to the library. The students are not permitted to use other students' Identity Cards.
- Strict silence should be observed in the library and its premises.
- Students shall keep their personal belongings such as bags, files, textbooks and notebooks etc., at the property counter at their own risk.



- In case any personal reading material has to be taken inside the library, permission must be sought from the library staff. All reading materials issued to them shall be shown to the official at the exit point before leaving the library.
- Use of mobile phones and laptops inside the library is strictly prohibited.
- Degree students may borrow and keep a maximum of 3 books and
- P.G. students 7 books at a time.
- Books issued from the library must be returned within 15 days or they can be renewed for a further period, if no one else has applied for the same books. Otherwise fine will be charged rupees 1/- per day per book from the due date till the book is returned to library.
- Loss of any issued book must be reported immediately to the librarian. For the loss of books, the following procedure will be followed:
- If a new edition or copies of the lost books are available with book suppliers, the book has to be replaced by a new one.
- If the lost book is not available for replacement the value of the lost book will be realized at the following rates:
- Ten times the face value of the books, which were published prior to 1944.
- Six times the face value of books, which were published in between 1944-1970
- Three times the face value of books in all other cases.
- If the book value cannot be ascertained from the library stock registers, compensation will be fixed on the basis of the market price of similar publication at the time of fixation.
- Sub-lending and transferring of books to other person's name are not allowed.
- Disfiguring the pages, scribbling on pages, tearing pages, spoiling
  and injuring of binding will be considered serious damage to books
  and in such cases they are either to be replaced by new copies or get
  bound by the borrowers themselves.
- Eating and sleeping are not allowed in the library.
- In all matters regarding the Library, the decision of the College Principal shall be final.
- Library is kept under CCTV surveillance.

#### **Hostel Rules**

1. Admission to the college hostel is only for one academic year. Students who seek admission to the hostel should submit fresh



application each and every year.

- 2. Study Hours: Study hours in the hostel are from 6.00 am to 7.30 am, 7.00 pm to
- 3. 8.30 pm and 9.30 pm to 10.30 pm. During the study time, students are expected to remain in their own rooms.
- 4. Students are not allowed to use mobile phones and are expected to maintain silence during the study time.
- 5. Food: Breakfast will be provided between 8.30 am and 9.15 am, Lunch between 12.30 pm and 1.15 pm and Dinner between 8.30 pm and 9.30 pm. Students should strictly adhere to these timings. No one is permitted to take food outside the mess hall.
- 6. Inmates of the hostel are not allowed to watch television during study hours and regular college hours (6.00 am to 7.30 am, 9.30 am to 12.30 pm, 1.30 pm to 3.30 pm, 7.00 pm to 8.30 pm and 9. 30 pm to 10.30 pm).
- 7. After 9.30 pm, students are not allowed to enter the rooms of other hostel inmates.
- 8. After 11.00 pm, except for study purpose, the inmates of the hostel are not expected to keep the lights in their rooms turned on.
- 9. No political activities are permitted within the hostel or its premises.
- 10. All residents of the hostel should extend their wholehearted support to maintain the general discipline of the hostel and must obey the hostel rules and regulations during their stay in the hostel. Violation of the hostel rules may attract fine and other strict disciplinary action including expulsion from the hostel and the institution.
- 11. Ragging in any form is banned inside and outside the hostel premises. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against the defaulters as per the law promulgated by the state.
- 12. Outsiders are not permitted in the hostel.
- 13. Students should obtain prior permission from the warden to go outside and they must report back to the hostel by 6.30 pm.
- 14. Students staying in the hostel are forbidden from smoking, consumption of alcoholic liquors, chewing of tobacco and using intoxicating drugs in the hostel. Students shall not enter the hostel premises in intoxicated state and should not possess such substances. Violation of this rule may lead to strict disciplinary action including expulsion from the hostel and rustication from the institute.
- 15. All students residing in the hostel must pay the hostel fee on or before the stipulated date, every month. Failing which may lead to expulsion from the hostel.
