Flood Relief Activities

Cleaning Activities

NSS volunteers of units 70 and 159 visited different flood relief camps in our district and offered aid in different areas like cleaning of colonies and camp sites. On 10/8/2018 group of 43 NSS volunteers visited flood relief camp in Kuppadi, Ambalavayal and Meenangadi. With the direction of local political workers they had cleaned 6 flood affected colony houses in the area. Group of 5 NSS volunteers conducted a survey among the camp inmates as per the direction of Village officer to understand the basic needs of the camp members.

On 15/8/2019 NSS volunteers visited relief camp at Perikallur Govt. LP School, Pulpally and conducted different activitie. 75 volunteers involved in flood affected house cleaning in a nearby colony, cleaned seven houses. Other group organized games and cultural events for entreating the children's in the relief camp. NSS volunteers also offered helping hand in camp kitchen.



Collection centre

St.Marys college was the collection center for district NSS cell. NSS unit in our college arranged storage area for flood relief items collected by various NSS units with in our district and also from other districts, with the support of college management and principal. All the flood relief items collected by NSS units from various sources were sorted out by the members in our NSS unit. In 2 days our unit prepared flood relief kits for the distribution in various affected areas. Collected items include food items, Dress, various house hold items other personal items.

Distribution

Various flood relief items collected by NSS units has distributed this items with the support of Nenmeni panchayath, Pulpally panchayath and Forest department. Forest department has provided vehicles for transporting these items to remote area like vadakkanad, Muthanga etc. Various panchayath helped NSS units to identify the families who were severely affected by land sliding and flood. Almost 150 NSS volunteers continuously worked in this process in packing, transportation and distribution over a period of three weeks.





Dress collection and Distribution

NSS volunteers have collected new dresses with the help of different organizations, mainly for children's and inner wears for the adults. These dresses have been distributed in various Paniya and Kattunaika colonies, who are suffering from unexpected flooding in the area. Volunteers visited the colonies at Vadakkanad, forest area near to St. Marys college, Sulthan Bathery.
